

***Play: Discovering “Flor de Nochebuena” by Desireé González-Miller***

**Listen and Imagine**

- Begin the lesson by playing or performing *Flor de Nochebuena* (Winter issue of *Piano Inspires Kids*, pages 10–11).
  - Invite students to listen actively and share what emotions or images come to mind.
    - Ask if the title, “The Burning Leaf” or “The Flower that Fades,” helps them imagine a story or picture. Encourage them to describe the colors or moods the music evokes.
  - Have students briefly research Desireé González-Miller, learning about her background, inspirations, and cultural influences.
    - Ask whether knowing her story or heritage changes how they hear the music.
  - Listen again and guide students to analyze and label the sections of the piece as A, B, and A'.
    - Discuss what makes each part sound different and what feels familiar when the first section returns.
    - Encourage students to think about how melody, rhythm, and dynamics create contrast.
    - Depending on their level, have them lightly label harmony changes such as tonic, subdominant, and dominant, or simply identify where the sound feels like “home” and “away.”
  - Experiment with tone and pedaling.
    - Play short phrases with and without pedal, then ask what changes when the pedal is used and how it affects the mood or flow.
    - Encourage students to connect pedal use to the emotional “color” of the piece, its warmth, brightness, or reflection.
  - Add a creative element by incorporating simple percussion instruments such as bells or shakers, or include a short spoken introduction: “This is our musical poinsettia—a gift of light and sound.”
  - Conclude the lesson with a short performance or recording that pairs the music with student drawings or reflections.
  - Finally, lead a short reflection. Ask what message of light or kindness the piece shares and how analyzing the harmony or structure deepened their connection to the music.
  - Invite them to consider how learning about the composer’s story guided their interpretation and understanding of the piece.
